International migration

- Inevitable and growing
- Not only 'South' > 'North'
- Heading increasingly to the city
- Targeted and adaptable (circular, temporary)





International migrants

- Generally poor, but not the poorest
- Mainly low-skilled, but entrepreneurial
- More and more women
- No generalization, many types of migrants

Assimilation: refusal of differences Multiculturalism: acceptanceof differences Interculturalism: equivalence of differences

Integration strategies

- from guest to citizen: all equals
- from emergency to project: long term vision
- from solidarity to promotion of citizenship: political inclusion





Local society, migrants and public space

- Collective space, collective place: the essence of the city (polis)
- Collective space, common values vs. diversity
- The use(s) of collective space as indicator of a local society's willingness to include or to exclude
