

SUMMER SCHOOL ON PRECARIOUS HOUSING WITH A FOCUS ON INTERNATIONAL MIGRANTS

The lack of adequate, affordable housing and the occurrence of informal, illegal, or unsafe housing across all EU Member States poses a threat to social inclusion and cohesion, and hinders the mobility of EU citizens and the integration of third-country nationals. However, the issue has not been taken up systematically in curricula in higher education across Europe so far. Therefore, targeted and multimedia learning materials focusing on these challenges are being produced by the PusH partnership. During our summer school, we combine these with hands-on activities to ensure an engaging learning atmosphere. We warmly invite students and lecturers to join us in Venice to learn more about one of the relevant challenges for contemporary Europe.

Contents:

- Introduction to the framework of housing insecurity in Europe, to stimulate reflection on a comparative, national and international level
- Field visits and meetings with NGOs supporting migrants' access to adequate housing through innovative solutions
- Ample space to debate and interaction, through exercises, focus groups and with the involvement of practitioners and activists
- Practical tasks, including international teamwork, development of materials and exchanges with European researchers
